8. 3 stems Multi-headed Narcissi, 1 variety
9. 3 stems Miniature Daffodils, 1 variety. Blooms less than 2" diameter
10. 5 stems Miniature Daffodils, mixed varieties. Blooms less than 2" diameter
11. 1 stem Any kind or variety
12. 5 stems Mixed varieties except miniatures
13. Vase/bowl Mixed Daffodils shown for frontal effect max 10" diameter
